



Dear friends in Christ,

The gift giving season is upon us. The stores are already filled with gift items, catalogs have arrived in the mail, and many of us have already started asking for wish lists from folks we love. Giving and receiving gifts at Christmas can be fun, but it can also be a bit hectic, too. Above all, we need to remember why we give at this time of year in the first place. Jesus came as an infant in a manger, and was destined for the cross and resurrection to be our Savior from sin and death. Through the gift of Jesus, we have a loving relationship with God our Father. The giving we do at Christmas serves as a reflection of this greatest gift of all.

I have a suggestion for a gift that we can all give to one another at Zion this December, and any visitors who may come to worship with us. It is called the G. I. F. T. Plan. This idea comes from Pastor Karl Vaters, who recently taught a small church conference for our Upper Susquehanna Synod.

G.I.F.T. stands for Greet, Introduce, Follow up, and Thank. You are encouraged to do at least one of the following every week.

1. GREET someone you've never met before.

Although many of us are very familiar with one another at Zion, perhaps there is someone you recognize but don't know their name. Or maybe you have never conversed. Ask them about themselves. Discover a bit about who they are. Especially if someone is visiting with us, it's time to do this.

2. INTRODUCE people to each other.

Once you have become familiar with someone, help them to get to know others, too. Help them to connect with other people with whom they might have something in common. Use this as an opportunity to extend invitations to groups like our Jolly Bunch, Sunday School, Disaster Relief Team, choir, or youth group.

3. FOLLOW UP on a recent conversation or encounter.

Find that person you spoke to a week or two ago and say 'hi' again. Call them by name. Engage in further conversation. Include them in your group of friends.




**Annual reports** should be submitted by the committee chairpersons **NO LATER** than December 31 in order to allow time to compile the annual report of the congregation.

**Nave Renewal Update, November 2018**

Our Nave Renewal project is moving along. Rolf Rohn, our liturgical designer, and artist Kathy Maglicco met with the Color and Appointments team again on October 21. Kathy Maglicco presented two different color schemes that included floor tile, wall colors, wood stains, and fabrics. The team worked with Kathy to choose the warmer of the two schemes which maintains much of the character of our present colors. Details of the front wall of the chancel were also determined. Lighter finishes were chosen for the walls and grillwork of the organ speaker system. The Gethsemane painting will be restored in a wooden frame and four matching wooden columns will span the front of the chancel. The “Holy, Holy Holy” lettering across the top of the chancel area will also be maintained. The team was careful to incorporate the suggestions of congregational members. Kathy will soon be completing her work and we will have a color board to display. Rolf Rohn is currently completing the latest set of drawings based upon work with the team. He is also preparing specifications to send to contractors for the bidding process. If you have any Questions, please contact Pastor Roux or Drew Potts, our Nave Renewal Committee Chairman. We will announce future meetings and everyone is welcome.

Affirmation and Response forms and Faith Promise cards were mailed to everyone in October. Please take the time to complete them and return them as soon as possible.


The “Affirmation and Response” form is used to indicate your intention to serve in one of the many ministries we undertake at Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church. We worship God and witness to his love, we support service ministries, we grow in knowledge through learning, and we enjoy one another in fellowship. Please look over the many opportunities to serve and hear the Holy Spirit’s call to you.

The “Faith Promise Card” is used to indicate how you plan to support the work of the Lord through giving in the coming year. Our General Fund pays our budgeted expenses throughout the year, the Building Fund can be used for any building expenses from repair to construction, and the Nave Improvement Fund will go toward the future renewal of our worship space. Again, consider how the Holy Spirit is calling you to give generously this coming year.

## Advent: Come, Lord Jesus!

The new Church year begins on the last Sunday in November with the season of Advent. Developed in the western Church in the fifth century, Advent is a season of preparation that looks toward both Bethlehem and the second coming of Jesus Christ. The color of Advent is a beautiful sky blue, symbolizing the sky high hopes we have in the coming of our Savior. The scripture lessons appointed for the season focus on the second coming; on John the Baptist, the Herald of Christ; and on the Blessed Virgin Mary as the obedient servant chosen to bear God's anointed one. We at Zion will make careful use of Advent to prepare our hearts and minds for Christmas and the second coming through our worship.

The Christmas season in the Church lasts from the evening of December 24th through January 5th. It is a full twelve days of celebrating the Nativity of Our Lord. The color of the Christmas season is white, the color of all the festivals of Christ, traditionally suggesting gladness, light, and joy. We will begin this season of celebrating with candlelight liturgies of carols and Holy Communion on Christmas Eve at 7:00 and 11:00 p.m. Come, join us for worship in December. We pray that all members of Zion, and all Christians everywhere, will enjoy a blessed Advent and Christmas.



#### 4. Engaging Writing

Just like fiction, some nonfiction books are so good they're hard to put down while others are sleep-inducing. Skim through books, pick a section to read, and you'll be able to tell right away if the book is well-written. Kids can learn how to do this with a bit of guidance from you.

#### 5. Reading Out of Order


Many nonfiction books, unless they are written in sequential or narrative form, are designed for readers to read in any order. In other words, you can jump to any section and read only that section. It's so liberating for kids who are used to reading novels cover to cover. Show kids how to use the table of contents, then tell them they can read sections of the book in any order. It will feel like breaking the rules!

#### 6. Choice

The late Maya Angelou said, "Any book that helps a child to form a habit of reading, to make reading one of his deep and continuing needs, is good for him." It's true. Watch the magic happen when you let your child pick any nonfiction book to read. Yes, any. Even if you think the book looks dumb, remember that it's not your opinion that matters here. Choice gives your kids ownership, power, and motivation.

Explore the great nonfiction selections for kids on the bookshelves in the narthex or in the library on the second floor. Check out period is two weeks.

### How to Get Kids to Read Nonfiction

Are your children reluctant *nonfiction* readers? If they're like most kids, they like reading fiction but spend less than four minutes a day reading nonfiction. Here's why reading nonfiction is so important to a daily reading diet: reading nonfiction develops reading comprehension, builds background knowledge, improves vocabulary, and develops analytical skills. Which is all good, right? So, how do you get kids to read more nonfiction?

#### 1. Go with Interests

Whether it's LEGOs, dogs, or princesses, find nonfiction books that match your children's passions. Include “how to” books that teach them how to yo-yo, knit, build simple machines, or whatever they find interesting.

#### 2. Compelling Visuals

We live in a visual culture. Kids want nonfiction book visuals that are up-to-date and colorful. Kids aren't attracted to black-and-white line drawings or photographs from the '70s. They want to see images that pop. Even the visual design is important. Look for books with colorful backgrounds, borders, headings, and text.

#### 3. Good Text-to-Picture Ratio

Kids do not want big blobs of text. Find nonfiction books with a good balance of text and visuals. White space and text size are important, too, especially for younger readers. Instead of small print covering an entire page, look for larger text balanced with both images and white space.
