

Stephen Ministry at Zion

What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a system through which members of Zion are trained and organized to help provide Christian caregiving to members of our congregation and community. This will multiply the amount of caring ministry Zion can provide by giving us a whole team of skilled caregivers who are equipped to bring Christ's healing love to people who are grieving, in crisis, or experiencing other stresses in life.

Who Benefits from Stephen Ministry?

Everybody benefits from Stephen Ministry. Those receiving care from Stephen Ministers benefit because they receive prayer and support throughout the crisis they face. Stephen Ministers benefit through the spiritual growth they experience from being involved in meaningful ministry. Our pastor benefits because caring ministry at Zion is expanded. And fewer people will slip through the cracks. Most of all *you* benefit from the knowledge that special care is available to you should you need it. In addition, you now have a place where you can refer a friend, neighbor, coworker, relative, or anyone else you know who is going through a difficult time so that they can receive special care when they need it most. Stephen Ministry makes Zion a much more caring place!

Who are Stephen Ministers?

Stephen Ministers are members of Zion who have gone through 50 hours of training to provide high-quality Christian care to individuals experiencing a crisis or challenge such as divorce, grief, loss of a job, hospitalization, relocation, or loneliness. Stephen Ministers are each assigned a care receiver and meet with that care receiver for about an hour a week. This caring relationship will last for as long as the care receiver needs it. If you would like more information on how to become a Stephen Minister or to receive care from one, please talk to Valli Rovenolt, Pastor Elkin, or Pastor Roux.

Dear friends in Christ,

"Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning." These words from Psalm 30 have provided comfort to God's people for thousands of years. Through my years of ministry I have often read Psalm 30 to folks who are going through a difficult time; for instance, cancer treatment, surgery, or another major medical event. This Psalm particularly touches the hearts of those who have walked through these troubling times and found themselves on the other side, restored and well once again.

The Psalm is narrated by a man who describes himself as prosperous and as strong as a mountain. In his strength he is able to say, "I shall never be moved." But something happens to him and he is near death. He believes it's the result of God hiding his face from him. Although that is his assumption, God's face and listening ear remain turned to the man even in the midst of his trouble. We know this because he is able to cry out to God in prayer, even arguing with God that he will no longer be able to praise God if he is dead! "Hear, O Lord, and be gracious to me!" he cries.

The Lord God heals the man and he lists off his many reasons for praising and thanking God. The Lord has drawn him up, healed him, raised up his soul and restored him to life. With thanks he dances before the Lord clothed in joy having taken off his sackcloth and mourning attitude. His long nights of weeping done and over, he proclaims the joy that comes when the morning sun rises upon him once again.

As I write this article we are on day four of our "social distancing" restrictions because of the coronavirus. Many businesses are closed, workers have been laid off, and schools and universities have sent students home for the time being. Medical personnel are preparing for the care of those who contract the coronavirus, or are already caring for cases who have reached the doors of their hospitals. It is a distressing time for everyone, and we echo the words of the ancient psalmist, "Hear, O Lord, and be gracious to us! Oh Lord, be our helper!"

We do not know how long this difficult time will last, but we do know how we can be at our best for the sake of God's kingdom. It may be that some of our neighbors could benefit from the delivery of a hot meal or the running of an errand. Let us at Zion church know who is in need so that we can work together to care for people. Even in the midst of this troubled time we can trust our Lord God to turn his face and ear to us when we seek his help.

With God's help and healing power, there will come a time when this crisis finally passes us by. May we be a people who face these difficulties with all our God given resources, as well as the peace of heart and mind that only Jesus Christ can give. In due time we will be able to gather again to worship and say, "O Lord my God, I cried to you for help, and you have healed me." As people of God we know, "Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning."




Holy Week at Zion

Holy Week begins with our celebration of The Sunday of the Passion, also known as Palm Sunday. We receive palms to raise up in worship, remembering Jesus' triumphant entrance through the Golden Gate in Jerusalem to begin the events of his suffering, death, and resurrection. We hear the story of the passionate love of Jesus from the Gospel of St. Luke.



Maundy Thursday begins with confession and absolution, then recalls the events of that final night for Jesus. The pastor and assistant will wash the feet of all who come forward, recalling the mandate ("Maundy") of Jesus to "Love one another as I have loved you." We then share the Lord's Supper at Jesus' command to "Do this, as often as you do it, in remembrance of me." After the meal, the altar is stripped in preparation for Good Friday.



Good Friday's liturgy is called "The Veneration of the Cross." We will hear the reading of the Passion according to St. John for the emphasis on the victory of Christ our King. Bidding Prayers are then prayed, followed by the procession with a rough hewn cross and the opportunity to pray at the foot of the cross.

Holy Saturday worship is known as "The Great Vigil of Easter." We begin as the day turns to evening, marking the beginning of the third day – the day of resurrection. We will gather outside for the lighting of the New Fire and the procession with the Paschal Candle. The candle represents Christ risen from the tomb. Once settled inside again, we will listen to the history of salvation through a series of Old Testament readings. We then move to the baptismal font for the baptism. Then we share the first Eucharist of Easter.



The days of Holy Week are the most important days of the year for a true believer. In the ritual drama of our worship we are drawn closer to Jesus Christ our Lord. You are greatly encouraged to be present with your family and enter fully into the mystery of salvation with the whole body of Christ
