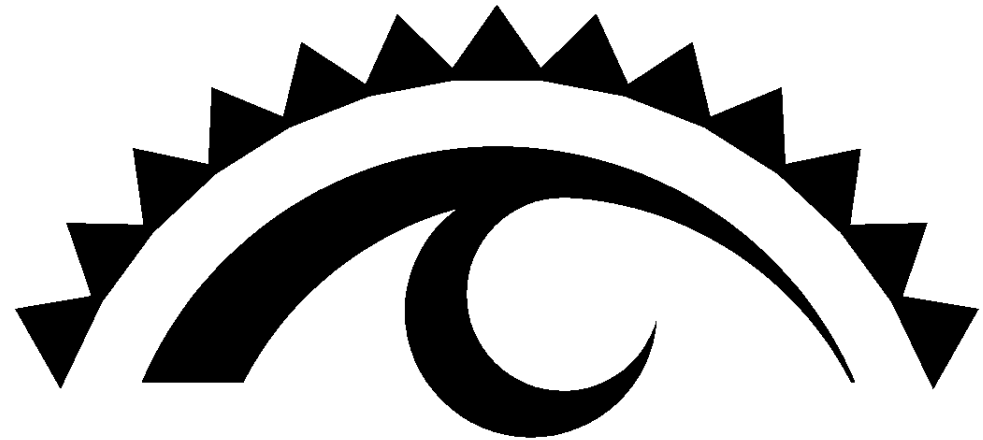
LORD'S PRAYER
