Dear friends in Christ,

Does God still speak to us today? Some fear that God might be inactive or uncaring in the brokenness and messiness of our lives. Yet, we have the Bible, which reminds us that God cares, God sees, and God speaks. The problem is that too often, we're just not listening. God is always ready to speak into our lives. We simply need to listen, tuning our ears and hearts to what he is saying in the book he inspired.

God wants to speak to us today, and everyday, through his word. We silence the sound of God's voice in our lives when we leave our Bible on the shelf. It's been said that "Complaining about God being silent when your Bible is closed is like complaining about not getting texts when your phone is turned off."

There are countless blessings and wisdom God wants to give us that will only come to us through his word. The author of Psalm 1 makes that case when he writes:

"God blesses those people who refuse evil advice and won't follow sinners or join in sneering at God. Instead, they find happiness in the Teaching of the Lord, and they think about it day and night. They are like trees growing beside a stream, trees that produce fruit in season and always have leaves. Those people succeed in everything they do." (Psalm 1:1–3 CEV)

There are two things that this passage calls us to do: walk away from sinful advice, and walk toward the word of God. We are called to make the Scriptures our happiness and be so familiar with them that they fill our thoughts day and night. God is not silent, he is always speaking to us through his word. But are we ready to patiently open our Bibles and listen to him?



Project Linus "Blanket Fellowship"



MS HS YOUTH GROUP * Kickoff *



your own watercraft. We'll be dividing into groups so everyone gets a turn out on the lake. We'll close our day with a picnic lunch. Bring a friend and join us!








