Dear friends in Christ,

If I were to ask you the question, "Where is Jesus?" what would you say? You may very well answer, Jesus is everywhere. If you did you would be right. According to the Gospel of St. John, Jesus is God's agent of creation. St. John writes "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being." As God's agent of creation, the presence of Jesus permeates all of the universe. We call it the "ubiquitous nature" of Jesus. He's in every leaf on every tree, he is in your shoe, and in what you eat for breakfast. Yes, Jesus is everywhere.

But, if I were to ask you where does Jesus promise to be helpful to us? the answer would be different. Jesus names three places in which he promises to be the most helpful to us, the places where he will be with us in all his fullness and forgiveness. The first place is when we gather in his name. In the Gospel of St. Matthew the 18th chapter, Jesus is teaching his disciples about how to deal with sins within the congregation. He talks about how important it is to talk with one another when there is conflict, and how other members of the church can be helpful in such conversations. To conclude his teaching, he says this, "Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." Jesus is telling us that he is present in our loving conversations with one another. He is present when we speak his Word. The place where we speak his Word on a regular basis is in the worship of the church. There we share his Word in Scriptures read, sermons preached, the prayers, the singing of hymns, the reciting of the Creeds, and all of the words of the liturgy. So this is the first place that Jesus promises to be, in the gathering in his name where we share his Word.

Another place that Jesus promises to be for us in all of this fullness and forgiveness, is in the sharing of the Holy Communion. The Scriptures attest that Jesus said, when he took the bread, "This is my body," and when he took the wine said, "This is my blood given and shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sins." So Jesus is promising to be really present in the sacrament. He is promising to be physically present, body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine of Holy Communion. In the eating and drinking together with God's baptized people, we are assured of the forgiveness of our sins. We are linked to Jesus' death and resurrection, and we receive newness of life, every time we consume his precious body and blood. So, Jesus promises to be in the gathering in his name, the Word spoken, and in the Holy Communion.

Yet another place that Jesus promises to be is in the sacrament of Holy Baptism. When Jesus ascends into heaven, St. Matthew records these words of Jesus, "All authority in heaven and earth has been given unto me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And lo, I am with you always, to the end of the age." So Jesus is promising to be with us whenever we baptize in the triune name and the washing of water, and also when we teach his commandments rightly. Again, this is a sacramental presence, Jesus is already present in the water of baptism, but by his Word of promise he is present in the water to bring us the forgiveness of sins. In the waters of baptism we die to our old sinful nature, and rise again with a new life given to us. Jesus unites us with his death and resurrection in baptism and covers us over with his own robe of righteousness, so that when the Father sees us he sees the presence of the Son wrapped around us. Jesus also promises to be present as we rightly teach his commandments to one another. Again, this is promise to be present in the Word spoken.

So "Where is Jesus?" You would be right if you were to say that he's everywhere. But it's even more right to say that Jesus is present in the places that he promises to be in all his fullness and forgiveness. Those places are the gathering in his name, where his Word is shared, his supper is eaten and drunk, and we baptize new children into the family of God. There is no other place on this earth besides the worship of the church were all of these things happen.

So one of the greatest truths that we can grasp as Christians is that Jesus comes to us powerfully in the worship of the church. That's why it's so important to regularly gather with the baptized to glorify our God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In the Word and in the sacraments Jesus will grant us new life. Martin Luther was right when he wrote in his Small Catechism the meaning of the third commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy. What does this mean for us? We are fear and love God so that we do not neglect his Word and the preaching of it, but regarded is holy and gladly hear and learn it." May you be faithful to the worship of Jesus Christ. Jesus will be there.

LIBRARY NOTES: A NAME YOU KNOW

Several weeks ago, I received a mystery package in the mail. When I opened it, I discovered a book by an author who is familiar to many of you... Pastor Bruce Amme. In his retirement he has self-published a collection of his sermons entitled, *On Journey with Christ: Homilies for Life's Seasons*. To quote Pastor Amme from his accompanying letter:

"Several years ago, I began gathering a collection of my homilies from over the years. The enclosed book is the result of my efforts. Throughout my years in ministry, my homilies have always represented my joys and my struggles in the faith. I wanted to gather several of them into a book with the hope that those who read them might share with me those experiences in the faith. I spent most of my full-time ministry at Zion Church. As a result, many of my reflections in the book come from those years spent with our sisters and brothers at Zion. But I also share experiences from earlier years as well as later. I hope that those who spend a little time in the pages of "*On Journey*..." and who share the faith with us will find some solace, some joy, and most especially all the peace that our Lord would offer us on any that we live, happy or sad."

The chapter contents are based loosely on the liturgical calendar (Advent, Christmas, Lent, etc.) as well as significant festivals such as All Saints' and Christ the King. Each chapter contains at least one homily. The text is interspersed with photographs and drawings.

Two copies of the book are available on the non-fiction side of the adult reading shelves in the narthex. Please use the sign-out card found inside the back cover if you wish to check out a copy to read at home. The loan period is two weeks.

Pastor Amme's hope is that, through his book, "it [will] be a way of sharing with the congregation what we shared in many ways over many years of time."


A Prayer for Reformation Day




IMPORTANT NOTICE
