

With all the things that take our attention this time of year, let us remember to truly show our love and caring through our gift giving.



Dear friends in Christ,

Everyone loves the Christmas season and many folks, especially children, would probably like to skip Advent and get right into celebrating Christmas. But the Church in her wisdom gives us the Advent season, not to hold us back from Christmas, but to make us ready to celebrate Christmas to the fullest! With that in mind, here are some ways that may help you enter into the Advent season most fully.

Prepare with prayer. Advent is a season of waiting, but it's not meant to be empty waiting. Be intentional about the time spent before celebrating Jesus' birth. Prepare your heart and mind to receive Christ at Christmas by establishing some helpful Advent practices. Here are a few you can consider:

Place an Advent calendar somewhere prominent in your home. We will be handing out Advent calendars at Zion soon, one for the adults and a special one for children with windows to open everyday to countdown to Christmas. Read the scriptures and prayers for each day.

Set up an Advent wreath and pray each night as you light the candles, focusing on the themes of each week: hope, peace, love, and joy.

Read the daily scripture readings on the "Taking Faith Home" sheet that comes each week in your bulletin. Reflect on the way God has worked over time to save us through his son, Jesus.

Intentionally find a way to give or serve. The Advent season is a most appropriate time to find new and deeper ways to give of yourself. As you anticipate Christ's coming to save you from spiritual poverty, consider how you can fulfill the needs of your neighbors. How can you give of yourself to share the love of Christ with those around you? One suggestion is to give to Zion's Youth Group when they go Christmas shopping for clothing for needy children in our area.

Invite someone to join you for Christmas worship. Advent is one of the most naturally evangelistic seasons we celebrate. While we are actively preparing our hearts by entering into the time of waiting for Christ, the rest of the world is sending Christmas cards, hanging lights and listening to secular Christmas music. Christmas is on everyone's minds, but everyone doesn't yet have a plan for entering into the true celebration of Christ coming to save humanity. Help someone, or a few people, in your life make that plan by inviting them to join you for Christmas Eve worship.

Advent is a season of waiting and anticipation and isn't meant to be rushed. Think of the generations of Israelites who waited for a savior to finally have their hope met in Jesus. Meditate on the slow journey of the Holy Family from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Don't try to skip this season. Even with the hustle and bustle that inevitably comes every December, find moments of slowness, steadiness and quiet to embrace the real waiting that is taking place. May God bless your Advent!

The new Church year begins on the First Sunday in December with the season of Advent. Developed in the western Church in the fifth century, Advent is a season of preparation that looks toward both Bethlehem and the second coming of Jesus Christ. We at Zion will make careful use of Advent to prepare our hearts and minds for Christmas and the second coming through our worship.

The Christmas season in the Church lasts from the evening of December 24th through January 5th. It is a full twelve days of celebrating the Nativity of Our Lord. The color of the Christmas season is white, the color of all the festivals of Christ, traditionally suggesting gladness, light, and joy. We will begin this season of celebrating with candlelight liturgies of carols and Holy Communion on Christmas Eve at 7:00 and 11:00 p.m.

Come, join us for worship in December. We pray that all members of Zion, and all Christians everywhere, will enjoy a blessed Advent and Christmas.





Here's some info on this year's theme: The Way

In the time following Jesus' Resurrection, the earliest followers adopted the name, 'The Way' to reflect the way they would strive to follow the teachings and habits of Jesus. To be a follower of 'the Way' was a matter of belief, of practice, and of identity in the one who saves. It was because they believed God was fulfilling God's promise of a New Exodus through the person and work of Jesus that they lived this new journey life-style.

Two thousand years later that New Exodus is still going-people are being brought out of the Exile of sin and death into the new in covenant

with God. We are still walking the "The Way" with Jesus. Youth will be invited to consider the way of Jesus, the challenges we encounter along the way, the cost of 'discipleship' or of following the way, and the joy we encounter on the way, particularly in the community of the beloved. Storytelling will include relating our historical journeys to modern-day stories of people who are currently striving to follow the way of Christ.


