

Dear friends in Christ,

St. John tells us why he wrote his Gospel: "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:30–31).

Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life - abundant life, forgiven life, and eternal life. Historically, the symbol for the Fourth Gospel is an eagle. The eagle soars high above, and it was said that the eagle could look into the sun, and such a perspective fills John's Gospel. John looks straight into the heart of Jesus, and records the



titles that Jesus uses to describe himself, the Son of Man, the Bread of Life, the Light of the World, the Gate, the Good Shepherd, the Resurrection and the Life, the True Vine, and the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Life in Jesus. That's God's gift to you!

This Lent, our life in Christ will be strengthened as we hear the witness of those in John's Gospel who journeyed to the cross. Along the way, we'll meet villains, such as Barabbas and Pontius Pilate, as well as sinners, such as Peter (who denied Jesus three times), Mary Magdalene (who was possessed by seven demons), and Judas Iscariot (who betrayed Jesus for thirty pieces of silver). Please join us for worship on Wednesdays in Lent at 9:00 a.m. or 7:00 p.m. and the days of Holy Week as we hear the witness of these people in John's Gospel with a sermon series:

Witnesses to Christ: People from His Passion

Ash Wednesday: John the Baptist, the Messenger

Week 1, February 21: Mary, the Sister of Lazarus and Martha

Week 2, February 28: Malchus, the Slave of the High Priest

Week 3, March 6: Peter, the Denying Disciple

Week 4, March 13: Barabbas, the Bandit Released

Week 5, March 20: Pontius Pilate, the Governor of Judea

Maundy Thursday: Judas Iscariot, the Betraying Disciple

Good Friday: John, the Gospel Writer

The Resurrection of Our Lord: Mary Magdalene, the Witness

WEDNESDAY LENTEN WORSHIP


Worship will be held on Wednesdays during Lent at both 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. The same scriptures and sermon will be used at both worship services.






