

## Dear friends in Christ,

Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" - Mark 11:9-10

And with those word, Holy Week began. Our observance of Holy Week and Easter Sunday will be upon us soon. Let's remember the events leading to Christ's crucifixion and resurrection and acknowledge their meaning. Reflect upon what happened on Palm Sunday, the Sunday before His crucifixion, when Jesus was welcomed into Jerusalem with coats and branches laid at His feet and people praising Him. Those shouting Hosanna, or "save us," were looking for an earthly warrior to rescue them from the harsh Roman rule.

Today, when we shout "Hosanna," we recognize that Jesus came to be our Savior from sin, death, and the power of evil. So on Palm Sunday, as we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, we're lifting our Hosannas to the only One who can truly save our lives.

On the Thursday after Palm Sunday, or Maundy Thursday, Jesus and His disciples met in the upper room to observe the Passover, now known as "The Last Supper." After washing His disciples' feet, Jesus held communion with them. He charged His disciples to eat the bread which is His broken body, and to drink the wine which is His shed blood. Jesus was establishing with them and all of us who share in this meal to this day a New Covenant of forgiveness. Imagine how mystified the disciples must have been until the events of the next few days unfolded.

After praying passionately in the Garden of Gethsemane in the late hours of Thursday night into Friday morning, Jesus was then betrayed by Judas and arrested. Over the next few hours, He was abandoned, falsely accused, beaten, mocked and condemned to death. And those who just a few days earlier were hailing Him as their King were suddenly yelling, "Crucify Him!" How many of us have just given up after experiencing only a fraction of the hatred and opposition He endured? Yet knowing what lay ahead of Him, He stood there silently and humbly.

Wearing nothing but a crown of thorns, Christ was hoisted up on a cross to hang in humiliation and endure an excruciatingly painful death. He was the Lamb of God, the ultimate sacrifice for the sins of the world. As St. Paul describes the event, "For our sake God made the one who knew no sin to be sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." - 2 Corinthians 5:21. How great His love for each of us must truly be to have taken the punishment we deserve upon Himself! As Jesus said to his disciples, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." - John 15:13 We must never forget how amazing His love is for us!

At 3 p.m. on Good Friday, Jesus breathed His last and died. He was placed in a tomb, which was sealed shut with a large stone and guarded by Roman soldiers.

Holy Saturday tells us the story doesn't end there! The Church since the time of the Apostles has gathered at sunset on Saturday to read the stories of salvation from the scriptures and baptize new children of God into His family. We remember that on Easter Sunday morning, before the sun rose, the stone that sealed the tomb was rolled away, and Jesus was resurrected. He overcame death so that those who trust in Him could also overcome death and one day live with Him eternally in the new Heaven and new Earth.

Holy Week is about remembering the only One who is truly holy—Jesus Christ. This coming Holy Week, let's take time to gratefully remember and keep alive in our hearts what Jesus, the perfect Lamb and the risen Savior, did for us years ago. He came. He died. And He rose again, so we could live in eternity with a loving God who gave His life for us in the greatest way possible.

I strongly encourage you to walk through the liturgies of Holy Week with us and revisit the details of Christ's crucifixion, death and resurrection. Listen carefully to the story from the scriptures. Prayerfully think about each of the events described there and their deep and life-changing meaning for each of us. Rejoice in the sacraments of Holy Communion and Baptism that we share. The walk together through Holy Week will make our Easter morning cry even more glorious, "Christ the Lord is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!"

Week 5, March 20: Pontius Pilate, the Governor of Judea, John 19:1–16


Maundy Thursday: Judas Iscariot, the Betraying Disciple, John 13:21–30








# WE ARE STILL IN NEED OF **TWO** MORE COUNCIL MEMBERS PLEASE CONSIDER SERVING.

Dear fellow members,

We have some exterior maintenance issues that need to be addressed. The rubber roof on the education/office building is at the end of its effective lifespan. It is a little over 20 years old. Additionally, there is exterior painting needed all around our facility.

Over the last couple of years there have been instances of water leaking through the roof and infiltrating into the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. We have paid roofing contractors to find and seal these leaks. We think the leaks have been addressed but worry every time it rains. We have been told by these contractors that we need to replace the roof.

The exterior painting has not been done in many years. There is evidence that some of the wood trim boards are deteriorating and need repaired or replaced. If you walk around the exterior of the building, you will notice peeling paint on the lintels over the nave windows, the canopies over the entrances, and that the exterior door at the driveway needs to be painted.

The Property committee has been working on obtaining quotes from various contractors for both the roof and painting throughout the past year.


It appears that the roof is going to cost \$60,000 and the painting \$20,000. We are confident that we can do some of the painting on the low areas and doors with volunteers so the painting should decrease. We are currently investigating methods of funding these two projects. We have \$9,075 in the "Roof Replacement Fund." Once we have more information about funding these projects, we will schedule a special congregational meeting to discuss and approve these projects and their funding sources. Please consider a gift to either the roof replacement fund, or earmark a donation for the painting. Finally, do not hesitate to contact me with any questions you may have.
