The Ascension of Our Lord Thursday, May 9, 2024

When Jesus walked this earth he was very clear about his mission. In Luke's Gospel he says, "For the Son of man came to seek and to save the lost." On Ascension Day we celebrate the triumphal return of Jesus Christ to heaven, his enthronement at the right hand of God, and that his mission was successfully accomplished. There are many benefits that Jesus shares with us because he has accomplished his mission.

The first benefit that we have as a result of Christ's Ascension is power over sin, death, and the devil. Without the mission of Jesus Christ, there is not a lot of hope for you when temptation comes your way. You may be a person of unusual willpower, but even you don't have much hope. But Jesus has come and has shown us that it is possible to be tempted and not give in. He was hated, but he didn't retaliate. Instead he responded to his enemies in love and truth. He was tempted in every way as we are, yet he overcame sin. He accomplished his mission to defeat sin, and he has given us the power of God. His power resides within us so that we can overcome sin. We share Christ's power, and this is a new reality because of Christ's successful mission.

What about death? People are naturally anxious about death; they try not to think about it. It's a terror to human existence. But Jesus has come and said, "I am the Resurrection and the Life. When I broke out of death, I trampled down death. My mission is accomplished. I have overcome death; you don't need to fear it." Death is not the period at the end of a sentence, it's a comma.

What about the devil? Have you ever felt that you experienced the presence of evil in a situation? You do not need to live in fear of that. Jesus stared down the devil in the wilderness. He overcame him at every turn and he ultimately defeated him at the Cross and at the Resurrection. Jesus has ascended in triumph. His mission is accomplished, and he shares his power with you and me. John writes in his first letter: "He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world." You don't need to fear the devil.

While Christ's victory over sin, death, and the devil is significant, there are more benefits. A second benefit that comes to us through the triumphal Ascension of Jesus Christ is that you and I now have access to Jesus anytime, anywhere. When Jesus came to earth he was painfully limited. He came as a baby, and he was totally dependent on Mary and Joseph. Just like all of us, he could only be in one place at one time. He couldn't be in Nazareth and in Jerusalem simultaneously. If you were sick, laying on your cot in Jerusalem, hoping for help, you had to wait until he physically came to Jerusalem. But forty days after his resurrection there was a shift.

This is told in the book of the Acts of the Apostles. Jesus was giving final instructions to his followers and he said, ""You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.'

And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

At first Jesus' Ascension doesn't seem positive or beneficial; he was taken away. But the reality is that he is now no longer limited to appearances one place at a time. He is available anytime, anywhere. There is nowhere you can go where Christ's presence and power are not available. There is no time when you will call on his name that he will not respond.

Cell phone companies like to brag about how great their coverage is, don't they? They tend to exaggerate how good their coverage really is. You see those maps on television commercials covered with red to show where you can get service. When Jesus was on earth he had a tightly defined geographical mission. He said he was sent to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. He was called the King of the Jews, and his mission was tightly and geographically focused on the one tiny Roman province of Judea. But now, through the Ascension, his glory and power extends over the whole world. Wherever you are, in the emergency room, on an airplane, or staying up at night with a sick loved one, Jesus is there for you.

Even though you forget to pray to him, he prays for you. You might think, "What is Jesus doing in heaven?" The Bible says he continually intercedes for us. He is praying for you and for me. You might also be thinking, "This situation is too big for me. I wish somebody would pray for me." You've got it! Whatever your need is, Jesus is praying for you.

Jesus has experienced the troubles of this life. He was tempted in every way as we are. He was spat upon, rejected, and tortured. Whatever difficult thing life brings your way, it has been dealt to him, and he understands and he prays for you. When we deal with difficult situations, we naturally want to go to somebody who has experienced the same thing. People who are able to relate to us are often the most encouraging to us. And right now, before the very throne of God, you have someone who knows what you are going through and he's interceding for you. Anytime, anywhere you have access to Jesus, and he is praying for you.

Lastly, as a result of Christ's Ascension, our lowly bodies are now destined for glory. Most people are disappointed with their bodies to some extent. Some of us want to lose some weight. Others are fighting illnesses. We may have bodies that bother us, and drag us down. They are flawed and they are wearing out. We all are going to die. Is there hope for us? The amazing truth of the Ascension is that a human body has entered heaven and will live forever.

Some people believe that when God saw our human plight and came to us in Jesus at Christmas, he put on a human suit and lived out his human life. And then following the Cross and the Resurrection, he was glad to take it off. That's heresy. For 2000 years, Christians have taught that Jesus went all the way when he took on our humanity. Not only did he take on every aspect of humanity, he took it on forever. Jesus, through his Ascension, has taken humanity into the presence of God. In the throne room of God, God the Son has a body with scars from the crucifixion. Jesus is forever at the right hand of God the Father and Jesus has become the first of many people who will carry resurrected human bodies into the presence of God.

Right now our bodies are weak, but one day, like the ascended Christ, they will be strong. Right now our bodies can be disappointing, but someday they will be empowered by the Holy Spirit and glorified. Right now our bodies are passing away, but in the new heaven and the new earth, like the ascended Christ, we will live forever. Many people think Christianity is merely spiritual. But it's actually a physical religion. It honors the body that you've been given by God, and someday you will live with him forever.

Do you see why we celebrate the Ascension? As a result of the Ascension, you and I have lasting confidence over sin, death, and the devil. Because of the Ascension, you and I now have access to the power, and the prayers of Jesus Christ anytime, anywhere. And be cause of the Ascension, our lowly bodies are destined for glory. In Paul's letter to the Philippians he writes, "God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." Worship Jesus for his Ascension and rejoice in his benefits. Amen.



Dear friends in Christ,

I will be going on a sabbatical this coming July through September and I want to let you know what it will mean for our ministry together.

What is a sabbatical? A sabbatical is a time set apart for renewal. It is based on the biblical command of keeping the Sabbath day: "Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is Sabbath to the Lord your God: you shall not do any work." - Exodus 20:8. A sabbatical for pastors models the example of Jesus, who frequently sought out a quiet place where he could meditate and pray. Our Upper Susquehanna Synod describes a sabbatical in this way:

"Sabbaticals provide ministers the opportunity to reflect on their call to ministry and their relationships with God and God's people. While the concept of a sabbatical in the business and academic world is tied to research and finishing advanced degrees, a sabbatical in the church is provided as time away from the busyness of daily ministry in order to nourish one's relationship with God for the sake of the minis try to which one has been called."

The guidelines of our Synod suggest that a sabbatical of three months be granted after seven years of service in the parish. When I was first called to Zion nineteen years ago, the opportunity to take sabbaticals was established as a part of the call. I took a sabbatical after my first nine years of service in 2104. It is now 10 years since my last sabbatical and it is time for me to again step away from the daily work, to experience renewal, and then return to this call equipped and refreshed to begin our work anew. The dates of my sabbatical will be July 1 through September 30. I will spend the time allotted for my sabbatical in rest, time with family, daily prayer, and spiritual reading. There will also be time for an organized retreat with colleagues and education.



Special Congregational Meeting Summary

A special congregational meeting was held on Sunday, April 14, 2024, following the 10:30 a.m. service. There was a total of thirty-eight members present. Currently the quorum requirement is twenty-two members. The purpose of this meeting was to decide how to fund two facilities related projects; (1) A new roof on the Educational Building, (2) Exterior painting, which includes replacing deteriorated wood trim. These projects were approved at our February 11, 2024, Congregational Meeting. The total cost of these projects is \$79,000.

Five options, in addition to the monies in the Roof Replacement Fund (\$12,816), were presented. The five options are: (1) using the balance of the Menges/Snyder/Hawley Fund (\$8,932.27). (2) using \$36,300 from the Scholarship Fund which currently has a principal balance of \$92,559. The \$36,300 would not be paid back to the Scholarship Fund. (3) Borrowing no more than \$21,000 from Scholarship Fund Principal and repaying it to the Scholarship Fund at a 4% annual percentage rate over the next five years. (5) Selling no more than 300 shares of Turbotville Bank stock at \$70 per share to decrease the amount we borrow from the Scholarship Fund.

- 1. Those present unanimously approved using the \$8,932.27 of the Menges/Snyder/Hawley fund to help fund the project. This money, in addition to the current balance of the Roof Replacement fund, totals \$21,748.27.
- 2. A proposal to withdrawal \$36,300 from the Scholarship Fund for use on the projects was unanimously approved. Currently, we have enough interest in the Scholarship fund to provide fifteen scholarships. The remaining balance of the Scholarship Fund, earning a 4% annual interest rate will provide three additional scholarships per year.
- 3. A proposal to withdrawal up to \$21,000 from the Scholarship Fund with the stipulation that these funds would be repaid to the fund over a five-year period at an interest rate of 4% was unanimously approved. The actual amount

that we need to borrow from the Scholarship Fund should be less than \$21,000 assuming donations the Roof Replacement Fund continue to be made. If we borrow the full \$21,000 a monthly payment of \$386.75 for the next five years would be required. This money will hopefully be raised through continued donations to the Roof Replacement Fund. We will conduct a "Educational Roof Replacement/Exterior Painting" pledge campaign.

- 4. A proposal to sell no more than 300 of the 2,000 shares of Turbotville National Bank stock at \$70 per share was presented, seconded, and discussed. The purpose of the stock sale was to reduce the amount of money to be borrowed from the Scholarship Fund discussed in item 3. For example, if 50 shares were sold at \$70 per share the borrowed amount would be reduced by \$3,500. If no shares were purchased, we would borrow the entire \$21,000 from the Scholarship Fund. Reducing the number of shares owned by the church would reduce the total amount of dividends received and used for global, local, and congregational use. Discussion concluded and a vote was taken, and motion did not carry.
- 5. The option of taking out another loan for the \$21,000 was not presented, nor seconded.

Motions were presented, seconded, and unanimously passed to award the roofing contract to Equity Roofing, LLC, and the painting contract to 360° Painting.

This concluded the meeting and we adjourned.


